#### **Monon South Trail...**

- Radius has been working with the state to acquire the Monon rail line.
- In 2020 and 2021, Radius led the efforts
  with Clark Dietz and Taylor Siefker Williams
  Design Group to work through a visioning
  process for converting the former rail line to
  a rail-trail.
- Radius Indiana then used the Vision Book as part of its funding application for the trail.













#### **Monon South Trail...**

- Acquisition of the rail line was completed.
- In January 2023, the project received \$29.5 million for the design and construction of the Monon South Trail project through IDNR's Next Level **Trails Program.**








Rural Trail











#### **Design Process...**

- The Clark Dietz Team was selected for implementation of the entire corridor.
- Team was developed to allow multiple design teams to simultaneously design the different sections in order to meet funding and construction requirements.
- Strategy was developed to focus on urbanized sections first, and then design and construct rural sections next.














#### **Design Process...**

- Our design process is divided into three phases:
  - Engineering Assessment.
  - Design of urbanized sections and critical crossings.
  - Design of rural sections.














#### **Engineering Assessment...**

- Inventory the corridor and provide infrastructure assessment for former rail line, bridges.
- Allow for the removal of rail lines (with the intent of preserving significant architectural artifacts)
- Complete survey of corridor.
- Initiate the preliminary community engagement process to determine preliminary design standards.



- CSX contractor is currently removing the existing tracks and other infrastructure not designated to remain.
- Survey work for the entire corridor is underway and nearing completion.
- Initial public outreach and engagement is underway.

- Identify local amenities and design considerations specific to the individual communities.














- Completed in 2021 to establish a preliminary long-term vision for the Monon South Rail Line and how it would interface with local communities along its route.
- The intent is to use the ideas generated in the sketchbook to generate design standards and preliminary design for the trail.

















# Public Engagement Strategy... Community Workshops- June


